A few highlights from the Month of Miracles include:

- · Extensive social media campaign highlighting the needs of Maynard Children's Hospital and provided examples of "where your money goes."

Transcutaneous Bilirubin Measurement

Hyperbilirubinemia (Jaundice) continues to be the most common cause of early neonatal readmissions which, as a result, causes severe neonatal encephalopathy in healthy term and nearterm infants worldwide. Transcutaneous Bilirubin (TcB) measurement is a way to find out how much bilirubin is in the blood without using a needle. Bilirubin is a substance that is made each day as red blood cells break down. Normally, the liver removes bilirubin in the blood, but a newborn baby's liver doesn't do this well right after birth. When there is a lot of bilirubin in the blood, the skin and whites of the eyes get yellow as a complication of Jaundice.



Care Fusion SiPAP Unit

This equipment is used to avoid placing artificial airways and to attempt earlier airway removal. The use of this noninvasive ventilation has less complications as compared to invasive mechanical ventilation which reduces the incidence of ventilator events such as pneumonia and lung damage from high pressures.



Rifton Hi/Lo Activity Chair

This special chair is designed to provide adaptable seating for children of many ages with special needs. In the pediatric rehabilitation treatment plan, there's a huge difference between active and passive sitting. For one, adaptive seating systems like this chair are made with quick adjustability in mind. Without tools and in a matter of seconds you can make adjustments to tilt, recline and height which allows a child to have their needs and postural abilities accommodated throughout the day. The Rifton Activity Chair can be raised to table height for homework and family meals and then quickly lowered to the floor so the child can join group settings for games and other social interaction at eye level. This provides a sense of belonging and inclusiveness that may not be possible in a standard wheelchair.



Penguin Milk Warmers

The neonatal patient population consists of patients that require primary nutritional needs consisting of mother's breastmilk, donor breastmilk or a specialty mixed formula with or without breastmilk. The majority of the parenteral nutrition provided to these patients require a warming process prior to administration since the milk is typically pumped or pre-mixed and placed in the refrigerator or freezer prior to administration. The primary focus of these warmers is to prevent cross contamination from a shared system within a unit as well as decreasing the risk of patients receiving the wrong breastmilk. This waterless milk warming system assists in prevention of potential contamination from tap water as well.
