At the hub of Vidant Cancer Care is the new Eddie and Jo Allison Smith Tower that opened in March 2018. This is a 418,000 square foot, six story facility on the campus of Vidant Medical Center in Greenville that houses both inpatient and outpatient cancer services under one roof.



Tower Features

- 96 inpatient rooms
- 58 specialty clinic rooms
- Advanced radiology services
- 3 outdoor healing gardens
- Soothing digital and permanent art native to eastern NC
- Symptom Management Clinic
- 60 infusion areas with views of healing gardens
- 5 radiation therapy suites
- Pharmacy and lab services
- Walking paths for meditation
- Resource room and complementary therapies
- Prevention Clinic



Since the tower has opened

- 43,091 outpatient registrations
- 29,255 patient visits in clinics
- 44,532 lab tests performed
- 30,040 doses of chemotherapy dispensed
- 18,109 infusion patients treated
- 8,200 outpatient medications filled
- 2,679 PET Scans completed
- 1,200 support and survivorship programs hosted
- 362 patients treated in symptom management
- More than 2,000 patients treated in Vidant Radiation Oncology which resulted in over 84,000 doses of radiation delivered

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES



Complementing the system-of-care, programs and services are an integral part of the comprehensive approach to reducing mortality and providing care throughout our region. Through philanthropic support, we have been able to provide and improve the following programs and services:

- **Patient Resources:** Patients who qualify at the federal poverty level can receive financial assistance for gas, food, electricity, prescriptions, transportation and child care due to the strain of medical costs for their cancer treatment.
- **Patient Navigation Program:** A system-wide nurse and/or social worker navigation program that provides specialized care customized for each patient, that is timely and cost effective. Cancer is a complex disease that may be diagnosed and treated by numerous disciplines. Navigators help patients to remove any barriers to care, assure seamless care delivery and refer patients/families to needed resources.
- **Diagnostic procedures:** These include procedures such as mammograms, bone scans, colonoscopies, and lung CT scans.
- **Oncology Outreach:** This includes community screenings, early detection and prevention programs for breast, lung, prostate and colon screenings, as well as educational/awareness programs.
- **Survivorship and Support Programs:** These include retreats for cancer survivors, as well as nutrition, exercise and equine therapy programs. There are also numerous support groups and programs for patients living with or touched by different types of cancer.
