IN THE NEWS

Vidant Health recently announced it had performed 2,000 Gamma Knife® procedures at Vidant Medical Center (VMC), marking an important milestone in Vidant's journey to provide state-of-the-art cancer care to those living in eastern North Carolina.

"I am incredibly proud of this important milestone in Vidant's collective work to realize a life without cancer," said Dr. Stuart Lee, chief, division of neurosurgery, Vidant Health and medical director of The Gamma Knife Center, Vidant Medical Center. "Our teams work passionately to support those battling cancer. Those across our region can access advanced technology close to home, which reduces the need to travel elsewhere to receive treatment. By performing 2,000 Gamma Knife® procedures, we are delivering on our mission to improve the health and well-being of eastern North Carolina."

The Gamma Knife® at VMC is one of only two in North Carolina and the newest version, the Gamma Knife®Icon, was installed in 2018. The Gamma Knife® works by destroying cells so they do not grow, which shrinks the size of brain tumors over time.



SERVICE LINE SPOTLIGHT

It's hard to believe that the doors of the East Carolina Heart Institute at Vidant Medical Center opened more than 10 years ago. Before COVID, the occasion was marked by tours of the facility, updates from leadership, and special recognition of Dr. Randolph Chitwood who helped put Greenville on the map as one of the leading heart-care centers in the world.

Chitwood also recently received the American Association for Thoracic Surgery Scientific Achievement Award. This award honors individuals who have achieved scientific contributions in the field of cardiac surgery worthy of the highest recognition the association can bestow. Although he has stepped away from clinical surgery, he continues to lead the way in education across the world with a busy schedule leading virtual conferences and a new eBook from the Society of Thoracic Surgeons. Congratulations, Dr. Chitwood!

The Vidant Heart and Vascular service line continues to focus on bringing the latest and most effective therapies to the patients of eastern North Carolina. Keeping care local by offering access to experts who pioneer heart and vascular surgical care solidifies our commitment to providing world class heart care close to home.

The heart and vascular program has celebrated many achievements throughout the last couple of years. Of particular note, our innovative robotic cardiac surgery program has been expanded to include advances in minimally invasive coronary bypass surgery, also known as beating heart surgery which eliminates the use of the heart-lung bypass machine and improves patient recovery times. We also continue to see great success with several of our other treatment programs. Recent data places our TAVR (Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement) in the top five percent of all programs in the country for clinical results.

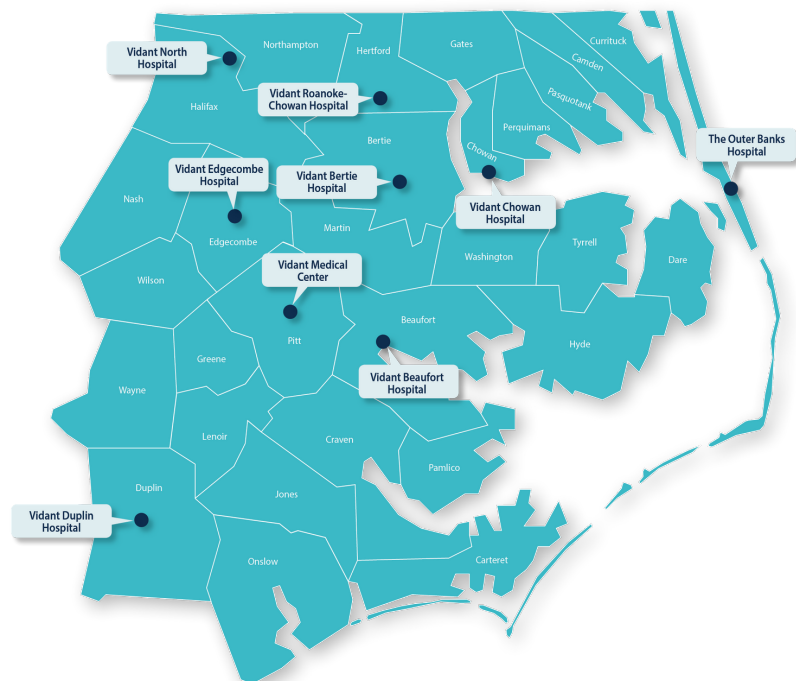
